EuroAfrica-ICT Cooperation Forums have also a long-established reputation for being events filled in with in-depth discussions and lively debates, networking opportunities and knowledge sharing among key stakeholders in the field and policymakers coming from all over Europe and Africa.

The "4th Euro-Africa Cooperation Forum on ICT Research" (Cape Town, Nov. 14-15, 2011) organizers invite the Euro-African ICT community to share information on technological developments that will support the strengthening of cooperation between the two regions. Contributions are welcomed from players across the entire ICT sphere and are intended to reflect ongoing technological advances and capabilities within R&D/ICT communities as well as forthcoming commercial deployments. Contributions have to include a consideration of relevant challenges in emerging economies and markets.

- Infrastructures & Access: e-Infrastructures & GÉANT (from research networking to global virtual research collaboration)
- Digital Library Services & Digital Content Infrastructures: e-Libraries & e-Content
- ICT for inclusion (social inclusion) & independent living: e-Inclusion, e-Adoption & e-Accessibility
- ICT for Environmental Sustainability and Energy Efficiency: e-Agriculture & e-Environment
- Evolution and convergence of networks, infrastructures, equipment and services towards Future Network solutions
- Software and services (in various sectors: enterprise, agriculture, etc.)
- Linking European and African ICT communities
- Trust, privacy and security in the Information Society
- Mobile devices and applications for development





Submission guidelines

Authors are invited to submit half-a-page abstracts to the conference selection committee (info@euroafrica-ict.org). Submissions have to be written in English and commercial presentations will be automatically rejected. Papers must be submitted electronically.

All received abstracts will be carefully evaluated on the following criteria: originality, significance, technical soundness, clarity of expression and interest to a wide audience. PPT presentations should not be more than 7-8 minutes. The "4th Euro-Africa Cooperation Forum on ICT Research" proceedings will be published online a couple of weeks after the event.

At least one of the authors of an accepted paper must attend the Conference to present the paper. An accepted paper must be registered before the registration deadline. The organizers reserve the right to exclude a paper from distribution after the conference if the paper is not presented at the Conference.

- Allow participants to exchange views, share information, and identify synergies in order to increase the impact of their activities
- Further support policy dialogues, discuss medium- to long term perspectives and agree on an overall and coherent vision

- Increase the number of African organizations involved in EU/FP7 collaborative projects on ICT research and enhance the development of Euro-Africa collaborative projects in the field
- Highlight the range and excellence of ICT research in Africa and in Europe
- Allow participative and interactive working sessions on ICT research and development through panel debates and interactive thematic sessions
